An extremely useful benefit of this work includes substantial cross-references and more than 5,000 citations to current authority, as well as a detailed master index to easily pinpoint a particular research topic.

The focus through-out is on law that impacts those conducting business or investment in the United States, including important chapters such as *Export and Import Laws and Regulations, Electronic Transfer of Funds, E-Commerce, Environmental Law, Motor Carrier Law, and Franchising.*

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Because U.S. law differs in so many ways, an entire chapter of this monumental work has been devoted to the area of Legal Research.
